### FORBES LIBRARY 2004 Annual Report 2004

2004 was notable for the hiring of a new director for the first time in twenty-five years, the hiring of the library's second assistant director and the retirement of two trustees, leaving two of the five seats vacant. David Bloomberg began his term as Trustee in January of 2004. The interior renovation was essentially finished but the construction of a new parking lot and new landscaping of the grounds continued from spring through the fall, remaining unfinished at year's end.

#### **Library Improvement Project**

Ron Alex of the architectural firm, LPBA of Cambridge, MA was hired for the exterior wall repointing project. The library's second floor renovation, designed by Philip Laird of Architectural Resources of Cambridge, received the Northampton Historical Commission's "Historic Preservation Award" on May 4<sup>th</sup>.

#### **FY05 Operating Budget**

\$928,530 was appropriated by the City of Northampton for operating expenses, with an additional \$36,600 expected from investments and state aid grants. State Aid Grants totaled \$40,400.37.

The Operating Budget was \$190,094.

The Personnel Budget was \$775,036.

#### FY05 Book Budget

The FY05 Book Budget was \$135,300, which included \$5,000 for software, \$2,000 for bindery expenses, \$4,200 for videos, \$6,600 for audio books, and \$7,000 for music cds.

#### **Funds**

Banknorth Investment Management Group of Pittsfield, MA was the investment manager for the library's funds. David Murphy was the portfolio manager and Charlene DeAngelo was the account administrator.

City Treasurer, George Zimmerman, placed the library's Clarke and Earle funds under the management of Richard Rogers of Morgan Stanley. Their value is \$477,000.

A new fund was established, the Richard C. Garvey Fund. Income from the parking meters will be deposited into this fund and income from the fund will be used to purchase books.

#### **Collections**

The library purchased three functioning antique clocks from Ray Bates of Brattleboro, Vermont:

- An American made late 19<sup>th</sup> century Seth Thomas (\$2,200) to be hung in the Reference Room
- An American made late 19<sup>th</sup> century round dial clock (\$2,300) to be hung in the main floor reading room
- A small mid 19<sup>th</sup> century British Post office clock (\$1,360) to be hung in the Director's office

#### Staff

Blaise Bisaillon, director of Forbes from 1979-2003 and acting director since November 2003, resigned on February 13th. Janet Moulding, Assistant Director, assumed the position of Interim Director February 16<sup>th</sup> until she was hired as the ninth Director of Forbes Library on April 2. Lisa Downing of Easthampton was hired at Assistant Director/Patron Services Librarian on October 4<sup>th</sup>. Julie Bartlett was hired as Archivist of the Calvin Coolidge Presidential Library and Museum. Working twenty hours per week, she began April 2. Norma Roche, Secretary to the Board of Trustees resigned on June 30. She was replaced by Elizabeth Barone of Florence.

#### **Northampton Events**

Forbes Library participated in Northampton's 350<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations in September, by mounting an exhibit of photographs from its collection in the Hosmer Gallery. The exhibit was entitled "150 Years of Northampton Photography at the Forbes". Prints included images produced from negatives in various formats, including nitrate, glass plate, stereoscopic cards, and glass lantern slides. The exhibit was supported by grants from the Northampton Arts Council, Kinkos, and Cornucopia. The library also participated in a city wide art walk, an exhibit by Hill Institute teachers in August, and as a member of the city wide read program, "On the Same Page."

New archivist, Julie Bartlett, was hired in April. The door of the Coolidge law office was loaned to the American Bar Association for an exhibit "America's Lawyer Presidents: From Law Office to Oval Office" in Chicago. The Coolidge Advisory Board was reformed and will meet quarterly. An unrestricted bequest of \$14,798.27 was received from the Estate of William H. McCrillis and a McCrillis Fund for CCPLM was created.
